Current fund raising projects

Replacement of Greer Road Bridge/Kings Mountain Trail \$60,000 cost estimate

This is the bridge into Huddart Park trails, at the end of Greer Road. The trail is called the Kings Mountain Trail. This is a critical bridge for equestrians from the Mounted Patrol and South Woodside to get into Huddart Park. The alternate route is to ride up the asphalt road and over the vehicle bridge, which can be a bit slippery when wet and is not desirable.

The creek has undermined the footing, and the bridge needs to be replaced with new footings that are set back from the bank at 8 to 12 feet. The new bridge will be longer (45 feet vs 24 feet) and require new beams. The County Parks team and the MP Foundation are developing a plan and budget to replace this bridge, which is estimated to be \$60,000 for materials.

Highlights of significant programs in 2024

The Woodside Equestrian Merit Scholarship

The Mounted Patrol Foundation and the Woodside-area Horse Owners Association (WHOA!) awarded their jointly-sponsored \$10,000 Woodside-area Equestrian Merit Scholarship to Zachary Koeller, a recent graduate of John F. Kennedy High School., who has outstanding involvement in equestrian activities as well as academic achievement and community service. His goal is to “major in Agricultural Communications ... and get involved with the colt starting program at Cal Poly SLO”.

There will be another scholarship in 2025 so if you know of an eligible youth, have them apply in the spring.

Miramontes Bypass Trail in Phleger Property

During the winter storms of the last several years, the old Miramontes trail that followed the West Union Creek was washed out, preventing access to the Phleger Estate Property (National Park Service). The Mounted Patrol Foundation worked closely with the NPS to support the design and building of a new bypass trail. The new trail was opened this summer, and the beautiful trails of Phleger are once again open to equestrians.

Lights at Jack Brook

The MP Foundation worked closely with San Mateo County Horsemen's to install lights at Jack Brook Horse Camp. Many thanks to Mike Bushue for his efforts to do the hard work to make this happen.

Rodeo Scholarships Awarded

Two outstanding participants in the 4th of July Rodeo were recognized. Jackson Lee from San Carlos was awarded \$2,000. He is planning to attend Montana State University. He competes in Chute Dogging, Steer Wrestling and team roping. Jessica Owens from Livermore was awarded \$1,000. She is planning to study Equine science at Reno or San Luis Obispo. These two young people represent the best of the West, and our future looks bright with young people like this

Summary Report for 2024

The Mounted Patrol of San Mateo County Foundation, or Mounted Patrol Foundation (“MPF”) was formed by the Mounted Patrol membership in 2002 for the purpose of charitable giving in support of horse-related activities.

There are two sources of donation funds: Board Reserves and Directed Donations.

The **Board Reserves Fund** was begun with \$54,000 of contributions from the founding members back in 2002-2004. In the years since, MP members have also contributed \$76,700 with their membership dues. Thanks to prudent investment practices over the years, the fund has grown to \$415,000, net of grants made from the fund. The goal of the Foundation is to make annual discretionary donations of up to 10% of the average principal balance of the fund to worthy equestrian causes in the area.

Project-Specific Funds/Donor-Directed Funds: These are funds raised for a specific project, or funds from a donor for a specified cause, such as the Pescadero Creek projects. This year these funds accounted for 34% of our giving.

In 2024, the Foundation has made charitable donations, discretionary and donor-directed, totaling \$35,240. The details are included in the table above. I encourage you to look at the Foundation’s website (<http://www.mountedpatrolfoundation.org>) for more detail on its grant-making.
